Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *May 12-18, 2024* as:

National Police Week

proclaim May 15, 2024 as:

National Police Memorial Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
