Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, higher education remains accessible and affordable for all West Virginians who want to continue their education or training; and

Whereas, postsecondary education supports individual growth, community development, and economic prosperity in the Mountain State; and

Whereas, the Great State of West Virginia offers more than \$100 million in state financial aid annually, making continued earning possible for all students, regardless of their income level; and

Whereas, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the gateway to making postsecondary learning attainable by opening doors to all state-sponsored, federal and collegiate financial aid programs; and

Whereas, West Virginia FAFSA Day serves as a crucial platform to raise awareness about the significance of FAFSA completion for all individuals wishing to pursue higher education; and

Whereas, this year's event emphasizes the urgency of timely FAFSA submission due to the launch of a new FAFSA in December 2023; and

Whereas, on West Virginia FAFSA Day, high schools and institutions of higher education will host activities that assist students and their families in navigating the FAFSA and college application process.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *February 1, 2024* as:

West Virginia FAFSA Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
