Whereas, the arts strengthen the innovative and entrepreneurial spirit attracting new businesses to our communities throughout our state; and

Whereas, arts education research shows that the arts help to foster discipline, creativity, imagination, self-expression, and problem-solving skills while also helping to develop a heightened appreciation of beauty and cross-cultural understanding; and

Whereas, the arts plays a unique and valuable role in the lives of our families, our communities, and our state.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *March 10, 2021* as:

West Virginia Arts Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
