A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, beginning on June 21, 2021, excessive rainfall caused flooding to businesses, homes, government buildings, educational facilities, and recreation facilities in and around Cameron in Marshall County West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the effects of the flooding pose a severe and continuing threat to the health, safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of Cameron and Marshall County.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby FIND AND DECLARE that a State of Emergency exists and continues throughout Marshall County, West Virginia, said State of Emergency to remain in effect for thirty days unless earlier terminated by subsequent Proclamation. In response to this State of Emergency, I have INVOKED the emergency powers set forth in West Virginia Code §15-5-6; UTILIZED the Emergency Operations Plan, as necessary; ORDERED appropriate personnel and resources to mobilize and respond to the emergency; and DELEGATED certain administrative powers to the Director of the West Virginia Division of Emergency Management, as necessary, to facilitate the provision of essential emergency services.
