## Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, more than 51.4 million Americans cannot read or write at the most basic level while 75.1 million Americans lack basic math skills, as well as the credentials and skills necessary to succeed in post-secondary education; and

Whereas, every year, one in three young adults drops out of high school; and

Whereas, as reported in 2019, there were 127,752 working-age adults (18-64) in the Mountain State without a high school credential; and

Whereas, American Action Forum estimates that America is short about 7.5 million private sector workers across all skill levels; and

Whereas, Adult Education programs contribute to solving these challenges by helping Americans move along the continuum in their educational journey to achieve basic skills, and get prepared for their careers and college; and

Whereas, Adult Education programs in high schools, adult schools, community colleges, and community centers offer low cost, high value programs that upgrade the skill set of our citizens; and

Whereas, the state of West Virginia celebrates Adult Education and Family Literacy Week as a proud participant in the national Educate & Elevate Campaign which helps our citizens learn about all of their Adult Education options to attain their professional and personal goals.


