Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine (WVSOM) was founded in 1972 and this year is celebrating its 50th anniversary; and

Whereas,

WVSOM is an integral part of healthcare delivery in the Mountain State and continues to fulfill its mission to
educate students from diverse backgrounds as lifelong learners in osteopathic medicine and complementary
health-related programs; to support and develop graduate medical education training; to advance scientific
knowledge through academic, clinical and basic science research; and to promote patient-centered,
evidence-based medicine, serving, first and foremost, the state of West Virginia and the health care needs of its
residents, emphasizing primary care in rural areas; and

Whereas, WVSOM is the largest medical school in West Virginia and, as recognized by the peer reviewed medical journal Academic Medicine, is number one in the nation among schools that graduate physicians who practice in rural areas; and

Whereas,

WVSOM has been recognized for 24 consecutive years as a top medical school by U.S. News and World
Report's "America's Best Graduate Schools," and is recognized by the publication as fourth in the nation for
producing the most primary care residents; and

Whereas,

WVSOM serves the entirety of West Virginia through its main campus in Lewisburg, its Statewide Campus regions including sites in Charleston, Huntington, Parkersburg, Bridgeport, Wheeling and Martinsburg, and its numerous clinical rotation partnerships with hospitals and clinics in West Virginia and surrounding states; and

Whereas, WVSOM's economic impact is greater than \$133 million per year throughout West Virginia, and when including contributions made by WVSOM alumni delivering healthcare the total economic impact is over \$1.5 billion per year in West Virginia; and

Whereas, the foundation of WVSOM's success is based on the lifelong contributions and tireless service of its over 3,370 graduates who practice in all 50 states and the District of Columbia, and the passion, dedication, and outstanding service of its faculty and staff over the past 50 years; and

Whereas, under the leadership of President James W. Nemitz, Ph.D., WVSOM will bury a time capsule on WVSOM's inaugural Founders Day and in honor of its 50th Anniversary to celebrate the history of WVSOM and those who played a pivotal role in WVSOM's inception; and

Whereas, the State of West Virginia and its citizens recognize the importance of WVSOM, its mission, programs, students, alumni, faculty and staff, and overall impact on the State of West Virginia and the United States, and, as a symbol of the State's appreciation to WVSOM and in honor of its accomplishments and positive impact, it is fitting that the State of West Virginia appropriately recognize WVSOM by proclaiming a specific day in its honor.

Now, Therefore, be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim **December 12, 2022** as:

West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine Founders Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
