Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, childhood cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children; and

Whereas, one in 285 children in the United States will be diagnosed by their 20th birthday; and

Whereas, 46 children per day or 16,790 children per year are diagnosed with cancer in the United

States; and

Whereas, the average age of diagnosis is six years old; and

Whereas, 80% of childhood cancer patients are diagnosed late and with metastatic disease; and

Whereas, on average there's been a 0.6 percent increase in incidence per year since the mid 1970's

resulting in an overall incidence increase of 24 percent over the last 40 years; and

Whereas, two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will have chronic health conditions as a result of

their treatment toxicity, with one quarter being classified as severe to life-threatening; and

Whereas, approximately one half of childhood cancer families rate the associated financial toxicity due

to out-of-pocket expenses as considerable to severe; and

Whereas, in the last 30 years only six new drugs have been approved by the FDA to specifically treat

childhood cancer; and

Whereas, hundreds of non-profit organizations at the local and national level including the American

Childhood Cancer Organization are helping children with cancer and their families

cope through educational, emotional and financial support.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *September 2023* as:

Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
