by Governor Jim Justice

- Whereas,** Emergency Medical Services are a vital public service and the members of the emergency medical teams are ready to provide lifesaving care to those in need 24 hours a day, seven days a week; and
- Whereas,** access to the quality emergency care dramatically improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience sudden illness or injury; and
- Whereas,** the Emergency Medical Services system consists of Emergency Physicians, Emergency Nurses, Emergency Medical Technicians, Paramedics, Fire-Fighters, Educators, Administrators and others; and
- Whereas,** the members of Emergency Medical Services teams, whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their life saving skills; and
- Whereas,** it is appropriate to recognize the value and accomplishments of the Emergency Medical Service providers by designating a week on behalf of Emergency Medical Services.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *May 21-27, 2023* as:

Emergency Medical Services Week

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
