Whereas, West Virginia Woman's Christian Temperance Union has for 140 years emphasized the

value of early training and educating youth to the dangers of legal and illegal drug use; and

Whereas, the Woman's Christian Temperance Union encourages all citizens to join them in promoting

a drug free lifestyle.
