AN AMENDED PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, beginning on the April 2, 2024, a severe thunderstorm with associated high winds occurred which caused flooding, downed trees, power outages, and road blockages across the State; and

WHEREAS, the effects of the storm have continued to pose a severe threat to the health, safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of certain counties;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby **AMEND** the State of Emergency declared by Proclamation dated April 2, 2024. The previously declared State of Emergency is hereby continued as amended to include Barbour, Brooke, Hancock, Marshall, Ohio, Wetzel, and Wood Counties; such state of emergency remains in full force and effect except for the changes made herein, and shall remain in effect for thirty days unless terminated by subsequent Proclamation.
