## Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, colorectal cancer is also the second-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States among men and women combined; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer is one of the few cancers that can be prevented with timely screening, but one in three eligible Americans are not up-to-date on screening; and

Whereas, the National Cancer Institute estimates that there could be as many as 4,500 additional colorectal cancer deaths because of the drop in screening due to COVID-19; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer is estimated to be the number one cause of death due to cancer for those ages twenty to forty-nine years old by 2030; and

Whereas, Black Americans are 20% more likely to be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and about 40% more likely to die from the disease than other groups; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer is expected to account for 11% of cancer deaths among Hispanic men and 9% of cancer deaths for Hispanic women; and

Whereas, the national goal established by the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable is to strive to increase timely colorectal cancer screening rates to 80 percent in every community for all Americans eligible for screening; and

Whereas, in 2023 there were approximately 153,020 new cases and 52,020 from colorectal cancer; and

Whereas, observing Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month during the month of March would provide a special opportunity to increase awareness and offer education on the importance of early detection and screening of colorectal cancer.

**Now, Therefore,** Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *March 2024* as:

## Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
