- Whereas,** the pursuit of higher education is a transformative journey that brings new opportunities and pathways to personal and professional success; and
- Whereas,** individuals who are the first in their families to attend college, pave the way for a brighter future for themselves, their families, and their communities; and
- Whereas,** the signing of the Higher Education Act of 1965 on November 8 by President Lyndon B. Johnson was a historic moment that established federal financial aid programs and key investments in colleges and universities, thereby promoting postsecondary access, retention, and completion for limited-income, first-generation college students; and
- Whereas,** the First Generation College Celebration, observed annually on the signing day of the Higher Education Act of 1965, serves as a reminder of the vital role that first-generation college students play in our society and their unique experiences, challenges, and triumphs; and
- Whereas,** we understand the importance of advancing an asset-based, national narrative of first-generation college students, recognizing the invaluable contributions they make to our state and nation; and
- Whereas,** the First Generation College Celebration strives to not only celebrate the achievements of first-generation college students but also to break down barriers that may hinder their success.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *November 8, 2024* as:

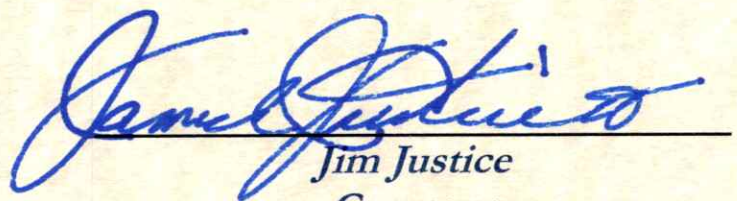
First Generation College Celebration Day
