- Whereas,** both men and women of our armed forces continue to be an inspiration to all of us through their demonstration of courage, leadership and commitment in service to our community and country; and
- Whereas,** we in the Mountain State will always remember and pay homage to our military community for their contributions, dedication, and for some; the ultimate sacrifice for the cause of our freedom.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *November 11, 2024* as:

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance and give special honor and recognition to the men and women who served in our armed forces.


In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of West Virginia to be affixed.
